

Attention: Parents of Incoming 7th Graders

An immunization checkup is recommended before school starts this fall

The West Virginia Department of Education in collaboration with the West Virginia Department of Health and Human Resources, Vaccines for Children Program and local health departments are sponsoring the “7th Grade Vaccination Initiative” to help ensure that adolescents have an opportunity to receive their Tdap (tetanus, diphtheria, and acellular pertussis) and MCV (meningococcal / meningitis) shots before the next school year. It is recommended that your child be screened for other immunizations that may be needed.

What can I do as a parent?

- Contact your family physician before school begins to see if your child is up-to-date on the immunizations.
- If your child is behind, they may suggest getting the shots at that time.
- You may also have your child’s immunization record checked at the Cabell-Huntington Health Department located at 703 7th Ave, on the following days and times:
